

Barra Fishing

I went to Townsville to visit my son for his birthday and he told me to bring my fly rod as he was going to organize a fishing session for me. Arriving at the private impoundment to try my hand at catching barra with fly the property owner said he had not seen a barra caught with a fly rod and fly. Rigging up with a clouser style fly I cast out into the centre of the dam and started stripping back through the crystal clear water. The third cast I managed to hook up but got busted off on a star picket

holding the pump in place. Moving away from the pump I found a school of fish feeding on the surface casting the fly past them and stripping back through them I could see that they were spooking as the fly came towards them, changing the fly to another colour I eventually hooked and landed my first Barra on fly but the fish were still shy so changing the fly yet again I had immediate success that lasted till we had to leave.

15th Century Salmon Recipe




Gut ye the Salmon. Take 1202s of white breadcrumbs, 4 ozs apricots (roughly chopped) 4 ozs raisins, salt and pepper, 1 or 2 eggs to bind the stuffing, milk teaspoon of dried mixed herbs. Push all this in the belly of ye salmon. To make the salt doe that encases the fish, 3lbs of flour, 1 lb of salt and some water. Roll it out. Put your fish in the middle and seal it up. Put it into a hot fire until the pastry is black. Do not eat ye the pastry.

At the recent Glenroy Crossing weekend, a couple of fishers headed downstream and, even though they were SURE where they were, they had no certainty, and definitely didn't know how long it would take to get back. Now in a perfect world we'd all have GPSs with topographic maps of the area, but in reality few of us do.

I would like to introduce you to Oziexplorer, a brilliant piece of software for PC and Android phones, which can combine your paper maps with GPS tracks and waypoints.

On your Android phone, please have a look at Androzic, a free version of Oziexplorer, and equally good. This software is available from http://android.appaix.com/androzic-21-58894.html. It can read your phone's GPS and position you on a map which you supply. There are a few free iPhone equivalents but I'm an Android user so you're better googling "andozic for iphone" and sorting it out yourself.



Now let me introduce you to the maps. I have the complete electronic collection of NSW and Victorian topographic maps. You can get the normal version from a website called maps.festy.org, but these have to be modified for Android use. I have the modified version.

So if anyone can see the benefit of having all the NSW topographic maps stored on your phone, and an app which will tell you where you came from, where you are, and the direction to where you want to go, then I would be delighted to supply the maps. I have them set up in two ways: one sorted by map number and one sorted by name, which is more use for humans.

The best feature of Androzic is the "open map at cursor" button, so no matter where you are, Androzic can find at least one map to place you.

There are a plethora of maps available for Oziexplorer/Androzic, but you can make your own. The free version of Oziexplorer on your PC can calibrate a scan of a map or a downloaded jpg, which you can then install into your phone.

This may all sound very nerdy and time-consuming, but I don't think it's either. I spent about an hour installing these maps into my phone, and now I can use that information to save my life. That was an hour well-spent.








Catch and Release – The practice of tossing your abundant catch overboard when you notice the game warden approaching.
