



How to Tie a Surf Candy BWC Style

Saturday 7th July turned out to be quite a windy, blustery day to be

tying flies. Luckily, we had the luxury of an indoors (airconditioned) venue to make the most of. Thanks to Mai-Wel for allowing us to use works facilities. The plan was to tie several flies for Salmon that can be tied without the use of the UV epoxy which not everyone has.

Shortly after sending out the last info email I was in contact with Brett from BWC Flies. So, after one missed call on Messenger and then a message on Messenger from Brett, I was halfway through sending a reply when I decided to call Brett back. Part way through the call we were briefly disconnected. Due to, or thanks to technology, (I'm still deciding on which one) we finally got to have a chat during which Brett graciously offered to come up for half a day and show the members how to tie a Surf Candy.

Members started to dribble in and after a quick house-keeping speil and an even quicker tour of the workshop (that wind was horendous and bitterly cold) we retired back to the tying room to prepare for the tying lesson. Brett and Cherie brought with them materials for the others to tie the candies and try using the UV Resin. They also brought enough materials to purchase on the day if members

required.

Brett gave a good explanation of the materials he uses to tie his candies of which most do not incorporate flash and those that do have very little flash.

Quite often the flash can put the salmon off, making them reluctant to bite.

Tail length can play an important part as well. You just don't know if the baitfish they are eating are 75, 50 or 30mm long.

Brett went through his tried and true techniques and methods for tying a simple, effective Salmon scoffing Surf Candy. From spacing, positioning and

securing the material and positioning the eyes to utilising the uv resin to hold the materials in place before starting to form the resin body, Brett explained each step carefully and thoroughly. Nothing was left out and with each question put forward, Brett took the time to answer explicitly with nothing left out.

Cherie was ever present answering questions about tactics and equipment including leader size and length for targeting the Salmon. Cherie is also an accomplished tier and had plenty of tying tips walking around the room helping out where she could, also sharing knowledge on the various materials used in tying the candies.

The BWC Surf Candy



Materials:

Hook: Gamakatsu SL12S #2 SS

Tail: Supreme Hair – White

Wing/Under Body: Supreme Hair - Olive

Eyes: Gold 3D Prism Eyes

Main Body: Solarez Thin UV Resin

Once Brett had gone through the steps on how to tie a candy, members started to set up their vices and materials ready with prime positions set up around Brett. It was good to see new member Tangus and 1st year rookie Shane eager to have a go at tying not only their first surf candy but their first fly ever. With Tallis, Kevin, Ray and Fiona all just as eager to tie their first surf candy as well, all working with the uv resin for the very first time.



Every one lined up tying their first surf candies under Brett's excellent tutorage. Rod and Cherie were present to help out along the way.

Whilst everyone was tying flies, Patrick and myself braved the big, bad outdoors to cook the sausage sizzle for lunch.



After rounding up all the paper towels that the wind decided to distribute to the packed tables in the background, Patrick showed a bit of rare dexterity wielding two sets of tongs. Mind you this was only so he could tend to the onion better.

There was a pic of Patrick munching on an allonion sandwich but fortunately it never made the cut....not a pretty site.

A huge thanks to Brett and Cherie for travelling up to participate on our fly tying day and to demonstrate tying several flies, also bringing
