








2023 Swansea Salmon Classic Jeff Yates

Either way, I'm glad he was able to catch a salmon on the weekend after the day we had on the Thursday!

Story:

After spending the morning trying to find them, we decided that if you can't catch 'em, buy 'em!, so got some fish and chips at Swansea for our lunch.

We headed back into the lake along the channel, a couple of hundred meters behind the other boat with Brent and Glenn, chips and fish on our laps, butcher's paper blowing in the breeze.

Suddenly we saw some splashes next to the boat. We'd found them! Unfortunately, the other boat by that point was well out of earshot. Oh well, more fish for us!

The Australian Salmon had schooled up in the shallows on the edge of the channel, near the sand opposite Pelican Beach, but were staying low in the water column, facing the current. They just weren't jumping. If it weren't for our boat spooking a few, we likely wouldn't have found them at all! Soon enough, a few other boats with anglers turned up, but the tide made things difficult.

After finally getting the boat into a suitable position, that wouldn't risk us getting stranded by the tide, both Tony and I managed to hook up. Alas, neither of us managed to get our fish into the boat. The reason for me dropping both of my fish was I'd seriously underestimated the size of tippet needed. 8lb is not enough, lesson learnt!

After what seemed like the better part of an hour, the other boat and its crew finally turned up. They quickly had a couple of fish in their boat, which considering we'd found the fish, didn't seem very fair!

After trying for a little longer, tired, and a little fed up, we decided to head back in. We'd been on the water for a long time, but it felt like longer. My sea legs didn't go away until the next day! We were both pretty tired, but happy that we'd had some action. It had gone better than I'd hoped for, and I'm thankful to Tony for the invitation.

Hopefully next time we won't have to buy our fish!


